THE CONTENT:

Sexual norms and behaviour in North America and Europe have changed dramatically since many of us were in training as clinicians, especially with the advent of the Internet, making a wide range of sexual choices explicit and easily accessible by just about everyone. Many of us have relied on consultation with colleagues, reading the sparse clinical literature, and attending continuing education events to gain up-to-date information.

Attempts at reconciling past theories to current clinical presentations have not always been successful nor useful. In the last decade or so, there has been a growing body of relevant research and more dialogue on the topic of addictive disorders and compulsive behaviours.

Both psychodynamic theorists and cognitive-behaviourists have made contributions to this early field of study. The WCPPA became aware of a need for more dialogue in this arena and saw an opportunity to join with clinicians of other orientations to share ideas about how to be better equipped to do our work. Dr. Aviel Goodman brings an extensive range of knowledge, experience and insights to this field.

Dr. Aviel Goodman will present to us this weekend an integrated theoretical framework for understanding addictive disorders in general, including complementary neurobiological and psychological formulations of the addictive process and will focus on what determines the selection of sexual behaviour for addictive use. He will distinguish addictions from compulsions and present a user-friendly integrated system for treating persons in the prisons of such torment.

THE FORMAT:

The format of the conference is designed to inspire interactive and inclusive discussions amongst attendees. There will be on-going opportunities for participants to share thoughts, ideas and questions throughout the program.

The afternoon session will include a "Samoan circle" style discussion which received high appreciation at our previous conference.
